Why Pray?

nd he told them a parable, to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. He said, "in a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor regarded man; and there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Vindicate me against my adversary,' For a while he refused; but afterward he said to himself, "Though I neither fear God nor regard man, yet I will vindicate her, or she will wear me out by her continual coming." And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will vindicate them speedily.

Nevertheless, when the Son of man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Luke 18:1-8)

It is significant that this word on prayer from the lips of Jesus immediately follows Luke's account of his second coming. Our Lord moves immediately from His word concerning HIs coming to this world concerning prayer, indicating the direct correlation between watchfulness and prayer.

The widow gave the judge no rest day and night. She was continually before his court, hounding him, harassing him, plaguing him until finally the judge was forced to act. He granted her request and she got what she needed! Right here lies the whole point of the story. What is Jesus after? He is simply indicating that this widow found the secret of handling reluctant judges! She discovered, in other words, the key to power. She found the one principle on which even a reluctant judge would act, despite his formidable defenses. "Now," says Jesus, "prayer is the countering principle which is the key to the Father-heart of God." Persistent pressure was the key to this unrighteous judge, perpetual prayer is the key to the activity of. When men talk about God, instead of with God, they are manifesting a deteriorated faith, for the purpose of all faith is to bring us into direct, personal, vital touch with God. You that have a concern about religion, why don't you pray?
